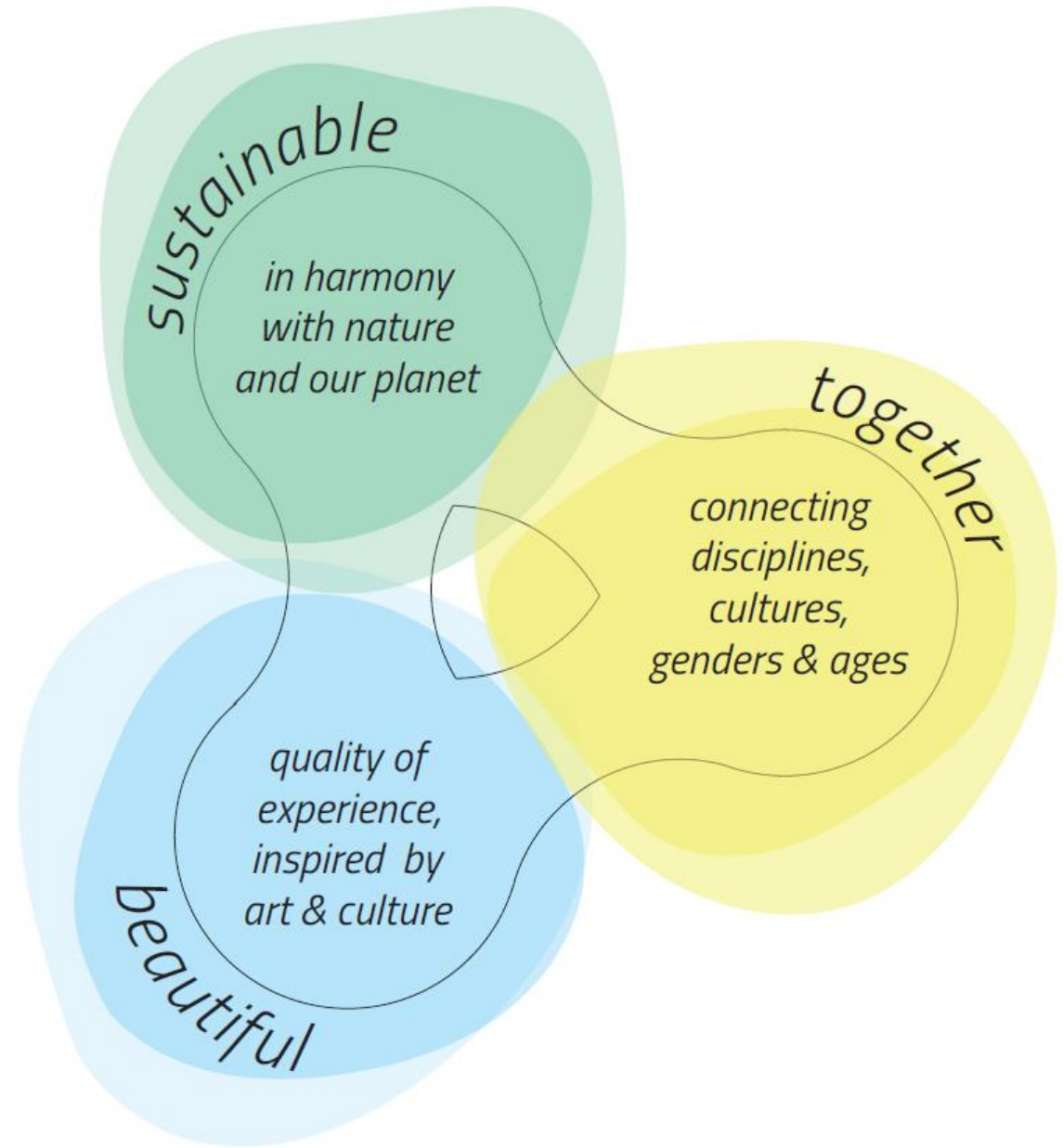

Why the built environment?

- Policy packages with **ambitious sufficiency, efficiency, and renewable energy** measures in built sector to reach net zero GHG emissions by 2050.
- Remove regulatory barriers to decarbonisation
- **Risk of lock-in buildings in carbon for decades**
- Mitigation interventions contribute **to achieving SDGs in all regions** while adapting buildings to future climate
